Ellen will be with us to complete the vest project started at our retreat in October. If you were not at retreat and would like to do a vest or tote bag with our logo on it you will need to get the pattern from Ellen. For those who didn't get to finish, this will be the time to do it.



For Ellen Rhone's project: Brushes: White Nylon #4, 8 & 12 flat; #3 round; #1 liner. If painting on a dark background (navy or dark denim) you will have to undercoat the design with White. Prep: Wash fabric, do not use a fabric softener. Apply pattern. Trace with black or white graphite; use an iron on pen if you like. Undercoat

if needed. If you need to undercoat, the background of the pattern is a circle 9 34 in diameter.



We will have a separate drawing at the end of the year for a Grand Door Prize for any contributions here also.





Chapter Donation option for SDP

Following is an explanation of the various SDP funds that a chapter may choose to support with monetary donations. Three of these are currently listed on the 2005 Chapter Achievement Award application that must be completed and returned to SDP by February 15, 2006.

There are four mandatory requirements that a chapter must fulfill. If applying for the Achievement Award, a chapter must also fulfill 10 of 21 additional activities during a calendar year that runs from January 1 through December 31 annually. Gateway historically fulfills more than 10 of these requirements and does receive an annual Chapter Achievement Award. Following is information concerning only the donation options open to a chapter.

- A. <u>SDP Member Scholarship Fund</u> which awards scholarship money to SDP members or chapters to further their education in decorative painting. Donations to this fund are used for the sole purpose of funding the awarded scholarships.
- B. <u>SDP Foundation general funds</u> which permits the Society to compete for federal grants and other funding, and which promotes worldwide interest in decorative painting. The costs generated from administering the Scholarship Fund are paid out of the Foundation general funds.
- C. <u>Decorative Arts Collection (DAC)</u> which provides a legal entity to collect items of historic and artistic merit to preserve art for the museum.

A brand new program first announced in the December 2005 Happenings Magazine is the SDP Jewel Program. It offers an opportunity for individual members or chapters to contribute specific amounts to help keep SDP strong. The funds from this program will be used to help SDP present fun items and programs that are not in the regular budget. There are six contribution levels: Diamond (\$1000), Emerald (\$500), Ruby (\$250), Sapphire (\$100), Topaz (\$50), and Amethyst (\$25). Each level will receive various types of acknowledgement in the Decorative Painter and the Nashville Conference program as well as other benefits which may include an SDP Jewel cloisonné pin, and/or a discount on SDP Boutique merchandise. If the donor is a Chapter, a one-time discount on chapter service charms will apply for Sapphire level and above.

We will discuss at the February meeting to which funds we wish to contribute and the amount of each should there be more than one. At the present time the Board is recommending a donation to the DAC in the amount of \$100.






Gateway Decorative Artists Chapter Meeting Minutes December 4, 2005



The Gateway Decorative Artists meeting and Christmas party was held on December 4, 2005 at Vivian's Vineyard in St. Charles, Missouri. All Board members were present.
