Dear Ms. Falk,

Form the bottom of my heart, My husband and I thank you for the generosity of your organization. On September 17th, 2008 my husband & I lost our son. This was the second child we have lost, and needless to say we were devastated. Our small consolation at the time was a beautiful memory box we received from the hospital to put our son's things in as a keepsake, one that your organization painted.

From a mother who lost her child, I think it's amazingly sweet and thoughtful to remember that there are innocent children who are taken from us way too soon. I can't thank you enough for providing these boxes for those of us who are so consumed in grief, we wouldn't have thought of having something so sweet to keep. I don't remember the name of the artist who painted our box, but I can tell you it was a dark blue bottom, with a light blue top and a bright yellow bird.

After we had a memorial service for our son, we found that some of our family members had given us money. As bad as this economy is, we don't need the money to cover any of the expenses and we don't feel right keeping the money. My husband & I decided to donate the money and we both agree we would like to donate the money to your organization. We would like to help other families who have lost a child and we were so touched by what you are doing that we both agree more memory boxed need to be made and sent out.

If possible, can you please let me know if there is someone else I need to speak with or where I can mail the funds. Please also let your members know that there are people out there who admire their talent and thank them for their generosity. Their efforts are greatly appreciated. It was a small comfort to know that there are people in this enormous world who understand and care about the loss of a child and easing the grief of the bereaved parents one small memory box at a time.
