GATEWAY DECORATIVE ARTISTS MEETING MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 20, 2009

Gloria called the meeting to order at 1:15 p.m. All board members were present. Ginger German gave a very nice invocation. Gloria welcomed all members and guests and thanked them for coming to the meeting.

Gloria asked if there were any corrections to the June minutes as printed in the Newsletter. Hearing no corrections, the minutes are approved as written.

Gloria asked if there were any questions to the Treasurer's Report. Maureen Wasserman had a question regarding \$400.00. Donna Wessel explained that this was for contract deposits for seminars. Hearing no further questions, the Treasurer's Report will be filed.

Gloria mentioned that there have been many rumors regarding Delta paints. Gloria read a letter she received from Kim Latham at Delta.

Last year's Gold Brush Award Recipient, Jean Rogenhofer, and her committee are now taking nominations for this year's Gold Brush Award. If you would like to nominate someone, please fill out the form and drop it in the Gold Brush Award box at the registration table.

Since we have so much going on today, we have decided to have the silent auction on the Kitty Wrap from the Peoria Convention at the November meeting.

Barb Ogden read the suggested changes to the By-Laws and explained the reason for suggesting these changes. Elizabeth McClintock made a motion to accept these changes and this was seconded by Barb Ogden. Motion was approved.

Cheryll Wilburn, our Nominating Chair, announced that she would be taking nominations from the membership for 2010 Officers. The person being nominated is required to be a member for 2 years and have attended 5 meetings. For President, Sue Struckhoff nominated Gloria Falk. There were no other nominations. For Program Chair, Lorie Reece volunteered to run again and there were no other nominations. For Newsletter Editor, Ingrid Oertli volunteered to run and there were no other nominations will also be taken at the November meeting. If you are not able to attend the November meeting, you may request an absentee ballot.

Cheryll has a friend that is starting a new business and has black aprons available with our logo in white. Gloria showed a sample apron. If anyone is interested, the cost is only \$8.00. See Gloria or Cheryll after the meeting for placing an order.

Vada reported that she attended a Christian Men's Breakfast Group and gave a talk about our Memory Box Program and took a sample Memory Box that she had painted. She received \$81.81 in donations for this program. Vada added a few dollars and gave Gateway a check for \$85.00. (Thank you, Vada!)

Jim gave a report on Retreat which is only 5 weeks away. We are in need of participants for the Gong Show. Brian Ellison volunteered, but we still need more. Retreat projects are on display. You can still sign up for Retreat.

Jim explained how we can help Riverbend Animal Shelter by getting an e-script card from Schnucks. Every time you shop at Schnucks, show your e-script card and a percentage of your purchase will go to Riverbend. Riverbend is full of animals, awaiting adoption. Help is needed to feed and care for the animals.

Since the 7 1/2 years that we have been doing Memory Boxes, we have shipped about 4,695 boxes. So far, this year, we have shipped 563 boxes. We have a Memory Box Paint-in the first Tuesday of each month, except November. Ginger German will be teaching the October paint-in.

The USO appreciates our donations, but they cannot accept hardback books. However, Turning Point will take hardback books and so will the Riverbend thrift shop.

Lorie reported that Maureen McNaughton patterns are on display. If you are signing up for her seminar, you can vote on 3 of the projects shown. The 3 receiving the most votes will be chosen for the seminar. The seminar will be January 8^t, 9th and 10th at the Wingate Inn. Cost is \$65.00/day.
