Great Job Ladies!!!







Margaret Von Kaenel's Sweet Potato Recipe—It was Delightful at the November Meeting—Enjoy!

Grilled Savory Sweet Potato and Red Pepper Salad – Weber's Real Grilling Cookbook Prep Time: 15 minutes Grilling Time: 20 minutes

Dressing:

- ¹/₄ cup olive oil
- 2 Tbls fresh lime juice
- 1 tsp. minced garlic
- 1 tsp. minced jalapeno pepper
- 1 tsp. salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. ground cumin
- ¹/₄ tsp. ground black pepper
- 1 ¹/₂ lbs. sweet potatoes
- 4 large red bell peppers
- 1 cup thinly sliced celery
- 3 green onions white and light green parts only, cut diagonally into thin slices
- 1/3 cup roughly chopped fresh cilantro leaves or 2 Tbs dried cilantro
 - 1. To make the dressing: In a small bowl, whisk all dressing ingredients.
 - 2. Trim the ends off the sweet potatoes. Peel and cut them crosswise into slices about $\frac{1}{2}$ inch thick. Lightly brush both sides with some dressing. Grill the sweet potatoes along with the bell peppers over Direct Medium heat, turning occasionally. The sweet potatoes are done when they can be easily poked with a knife, about 20 minutes. The bell peppers are done when the skin blackens and blisters all over, 12 15 minutes.
 - 3. Cut the sweet potatoes into ½ inch pieces and put them in a large bowl. Add enough dressing to moisten them (you may not need all of it). Place the peppers in a small bowl and cover with plastic wrap to trap the steam and set aside for a t least 5 minutes, then remove the peppers from the bowl and peel away the charred skins. Cut off the tops and remove the seeds. Cut the peppers into ½ inch pieces. Add the peppers to the bowl along with the celery, onions and cilantro. Mix well. If desired, add some of the remaining dressing and mix well. Serve at room temperature. Makes 6 servings.

I don't typically make this on the grill, and modify by cutting the sweet potatoes into the ½ inch cubes, then roasting them in the oven until they are done. I have a grill I place over my burners and roast the peppers on the stove top, then put them in a paper bag to cool before cutting, deseeding and deveining. Enjoy!!


