Lorie asked if there were any questions regarding the Treasurer's Report. Hearing no questions, the Treasurer's Report will be filed.

Lorie thanked the Refreshment Committee for all the good refreshments and the table decorations.

# **Board Member Duties & Responsibilites**

#### The President's duties shall be:\_

- a. Preside over chapter meetings.
- b. Preside over meetings of the Executive Board and be responsible for orientation of new Board members.
- c. Appoint a Parliamentarian with Board approval. It should be someone in which the President has confidence. (See Article XI for Parliamentarian Duties)
- $\ensuremath{\mathrm{d}}$  . Sign checks in the absence of the Treasurer.
- e. Ascertain that all required reports and correspondence are sent to the SDP.
- ${\rm f.}~$  Perform such other duties as usually pertain to the office.
- g. Be an ex-officio member of the Executive Board for the year following the elected term, serving in a non-voting advisory capacity, and must be a current year member.
- h. Appoint all Standing and Special Committee Chairs, with Board approval. The President may serve in an unofficial capacity on all committees with the exception of the Nominating Committee and Gold Brush Award Committee.
- i. Appoint tellers to count election ballots.
- j. Keep accurate records of office expenditures and receipts for not less than the prior three (3) years

#### The Program Chairman's duties shall be:\_

- a. To procure educational or related programs for each meeting.
- b. To arrange and oversee seminars and special educational events.
- c. To arrange and procure rooms for all chapter meetings and seminars.
- d. Keep accurate records of office expenditures and receipts for each planned program for not less than the prior three (3) years.

#### The Newsletter Editor's duties shall be:\_

- a. Ensure Newsletter is published and delivered at least 10 days prior to established meetings, but not more than fourteen (14) days. The delivery of said newsletter will be through email and only sent USPS when email is not an option.
- b. Provide to members electronically or via flyers, information relative to special events, seminars, etc.
- c. Keep accurate records of expenditures and receipts for not less than the prior three (3) years.
- $d. \ \ \,$  Mail one copy of all publications to Chapters Department of the SDP.
- e. Be responsible for getting information to the Web Editor in a timely manner.
- $f. \ \ \, \mbox{Keep}$  one copy of each newsletter since becoming an affiliated chapter.
- g. Procure a membership address list from the Membership Secretary at the first Board meeting, and updates as they occur.\_
- 1. The Executive Board shall consist of the elected officers of the Chapter.
- 2. The duties of the Executive Board shall be:
- a. To transact necessary business in the intervals between Chapter meetings.
- b. To establish the dates of the three (3) remaining meetings as stated in the Standing Rules.
- c. To approve payment of routine bills.
- d. To approve the investment of any funds of at least one thousand dollars (\$1,000).
- e. President being ex-officio for one year following the expiration of the term of office and will serve in a nonvoting, advisory capacity to the Executive Board.
- f. The Executive Board may, at their discretion, from time to time choose to subsidize, partially or in full, an educational activity for the benefit of current chapter members, or the public in general, utilizing available funds in the Chapter's checking or savings accounts.
