PALS (Pets – A – Lone Sanctuary)



THE GREAT NEWS IS: In the last couple of months PALS has adopted out over 40 animals. THE SAD NEWS IS: They still have over 25 dogs and 70 cats that need a Forever Home. The volunteers work so hard for these animals while they are at the shelter and they work even harder to find them a "Forever Home".

INFO: The shelter has a contract with Science Diet – that is the only kind of food they can feed the cats and dogs there. When they get other types of food donated they give that food to the people adopting an animal –or- they give it to the prison program. PALS has a program with inmates that learn to care for animals while they are incarcerated.

PALS have set up a LONELY HEARTS CLUB on their website for animals that have been at the Shelter for over a year or MORE. For instance - To adopt a cat from the Lonely \checkmark Club, the charge is only \$30. They have gone through an extensive veterinary exam; they are up on their shots and have been micro chipped. There is nothing wrong with these animals, they are as sweet, loving and cuddly as the others, it's just they have been overlooked for possibly a younger cat, or a different breed of cat.
