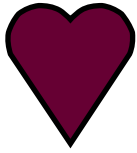
We have lost a few members this year. To those that have moved on to pursue other venues of their lives, I wish them all the best and hope they can come back and visit with us. They will be missed.

GOLD BRUSH AWARDED TO JANIE PARISI

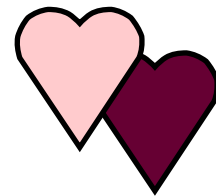

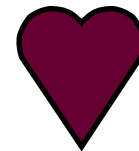
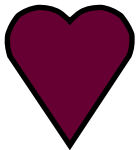
TURNING POINT WOMEN'S SHELTER

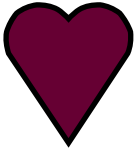

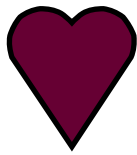

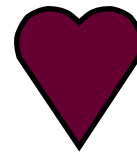
