Retreat 2016 will be held September 23-25, at TODDHALL Retreat and Conference Center, in Columbia, IL.

At the November meeting I will be handing out the Project Submission Forms. Anyone interested in teaching a project at Retreat must get a form from me. The only requirement to teach at Retreat is to be a current GDA member.

I tried to address as many concerns as possible that were stated on the survey you returned earlier this year. The majority asked for:

- A fall retreat—you got it, Sept. 23-25, 2016.
- Closer to home—no more than 30 minutes from St. Louis. (45 from my house)
- Affordable—you bet!
- A place to gather—there is a very nice gathering place in our meeting house.

The one concern; that more mediums are taught, depends on what projects are submitted and selected.

The sleeping rooms have 2 twin beds with a private bath, for \$40 per night per person. Six meals for the whole weekend will be \$43 (served cafeteria style). The registration fee for Retreat will be \$35. **You can enjoy the entire weekend away from home for less than \$160.** Plus whatever classes you choose to take.

We have reserved the Barn, for our meeting room with a nice gathering place. We have the last 9 sleeping rooms reserved that will accommodate 18 guests.

We're going to offer a little bit different format next year. With fewer attendees we will be cutting back on classes. Instead of 6 classes, we will have 4. There will be 3 "Round Robin" make it take it's on Saturday night. To fit this in, we are eliminating Saturday night's entertainment.

We need everyone who has thought about teaching, to submit a project. It does not have to be your original design but you do need written "permission to teach" from the original artist.

Members will be allowed to submit one 4 hour class project. Class selection will be done at the February meeting. We will have 4 different teachers. Hopefully we'll have several mediums to choose from.

I hope all of you plan to come to Retreat, submit a project or work on a committee. You'll have a great time getting together, painting and making new friends. The more involved you get the more fun you'll have.



Don't forget Gloria Falk's Sharing Work Shop. It is a lovely oil piece and we will start registration at the meeting.


A great big Thank You to the ladies who painted with Cheri Rol last month. It was a wonderful seminar and I am hoping those who finished their projects will show them off.

RECORDING SECRETARY, MINUTES — Debbie Finklang

The Gateway Decorative Artists Meeting was called to order on Sept. 13, 2015 by Vice President Ellen Rhone. The invocation was given by Barb Ogden.

Ellen asked if there were any questions regarding the Treasurer's Report. Hearing no questions, the Treasurer's report was approved as written.

Ellen asked if there were any changes to the previous meeting minutes. Hearing no correction, minutes were accepted as written.

Ellen provided information for next year's Retreat:

Last year's costs exceeded income by \$0.84 thanks to the many donations given for the Retreat For the 2016 Retreat - Everyone is invited and she would love to see everyone attend. The retreat is going to be held at Todd Hall in Columbia, IL on Sept. 23-25, 2016. The location is set in the woods, with gardens and a gorgeous area.

She went through the surveys and the biggest concerns were: affordability, locations closer to home and to hold the retreat in the fall again. She has tried to address these. The registration fee will be lower due to reduced costs.

Cost reductions came through the location, using only one room for classes, eliminating the Saturday night banquet in order to have another class. One class will be held at a time so that classes are not competing against each other. Friday night classes will be a Round Robin Make It-Take Its.

All of the classes will be held on one level. See their website for details and amenities. You do not have to stay in the facility to attend the classes. You can commute and pay for just the food during your stay (if you chose to use their food services). We may need to walk across a parking lot to get to the cafeteria, but we can leave our painting supplies in the meeting room.

Costs: \$40/night per person. Meals for the weekend: \$40 per person. You can pay individually for the meals. The weekend costs would be \$160.

We would love to have 7 different teachers doing 7 different projects. Each teacher needs to submit 1 project and 1 MITI. If it's not your design, you MUST have permission from the design's owner to teach the class and also permission to either duplicate the pattern or if the pattern must be purchased by each person taking the class. The instructor would be responsible for purchasing them. The teacher permission forms will be available at the November meeting.

The Program Chairman Barb Ogden gave the following information:

Cheri Rol seminar on 10/16, 10/17 & 10/18/15 classes will be held as Quality Testing, assuming that Lorie's brother doesn't have a class going on. Cheri will provide a paint palette for every day at the cost of \$5.00 each. You are welcome to use your own paints.

Mark Polomchak will be the seminar for next year on May 21-23, 2016 (Saturday – Monday). Details regarding cost will be communicated at a later date. It is a watercolor class, hopefully to be held at the Holiday Inn. Details to follow.

Sharing Workshops: Ellen Rhone on 9/19/15 at Quality Testing.

The Christmas Party will be held at Andre's in South County, St. Louis on December 6th. The sign-ups will be at the next meeting.



ARTICLE VII: DUTIES OF ELECTED OFFICERS

1. The President's duties shall be:

- a. Preside over Chapter meetings.
- b. Preside over meetings of the Executive Board and be responsible for orientation of new Board Members.
- c. Appoint a Parliamentarian with Board approval. It should be someone in which the President has confidence. (See Article XI for Parliamentarian duties.)
- d. Sign checks in the absence of the Treasurer.
- e. Ascertain that all required reports and correspondence are sent to the SDP
- f. Perform such other duties as usually pertain to the office.
- g. Be an ex-officio member of the Executive Board for the year following the elected term, serving in a non-voting advisory capacity, and must be a current year member.
- h. Appoint all Standing and Special Committee Chairs, with Board approval. The President may serve in an unofficial capacity on all committees with the exception of the Nominating Committee and Gold Brush Award Committee.
- i. Appoint tellers to count election ballots.
- **i.** Keep accurate records of office expenditures and receipts for not less than the prior three (3) years.

3. The Program Chairman's duties shall be:

- a. To procure educational or related programs for each meeting.
- b. To arrange and oversee seminars and special educational events.
- c. To arrange and procure rooms for all Chapter meetings and seminars.
- d. Keep accurate records of office expenditures and receipts for each planned program for not less than the prior three (3) years.

7. The Newsletter Editor's duties shall be:

- a. Ensure newsletter is published and delivered at least ten (10) days prior to established meetings but not more than fourteen (14) days. The delivery of said newsletter will be email and only sent USPS when email is not an option
- b. Provide to members electronically or via flyers, information relative to special events, seminars, etc.
- c. Keep accurate records of expenditures and receipts for not less than the prior three (3) years.
- d. Mail one copy of all publications to Chapter's department of the SDP.
- e. Be responsible for getting information to the Web Editor in a timely manner.
- f. Keep one copy of each newsletter since becoming and affiliated Chapter.
- g. Procure a membership address list from the Membership Secretary at the first Board meeting and updates as they occur.

THOUGHTS FOR GOLD BRUSH NOMINATIONS

Did you know?

You the individual chapter member, are the ignition switch that initiates the annual Gold Brush process. You play a very key role that culminates in December at the Christmas Party when the next Gold Brush Award recipient is announced. Your decision to write a name on the Gold Brush Nomination Form should be given as much careful thought and consideration as that of the committee whose solemn duty and responsibility It is to evaluate that nominee.

Just how well do you know the person you are thinking of nominating when it comes to their service to the chapter? Do you know how long they have been a chapter member? Do you know if they have ever served on the board — in what positions, for how long, how many times? Have they chaired or served on any committees? How often do they attend chapter meetings, support seminars or workshops. Do you see them helping to set up for events/activities? Do you see them staying behind to help clean up after a function? Do they regularly volunteer to teach a workshop, retreat class, paint-in project, make-it-take-it? Do they support our chapter charities? Would you consider them a "mover and a shaker"? Do they stand out as a doer and a team player? Are they a leader — someone you can admire and respect? Are they a positive promoter of Gateway Decorative Artists? Do they have a positive and supportive attitude toward the SDP? Do they support the National Museum of Decorative Painting? How many check marks can you put in their plus column? If the answer is many, you are probably on the right track.

Do you know how or from whom to obtain any of the above information you need in order to make an informed decision? Did you know that the Membership Chair keeps a card file on every current, active chapter members that lists a lot of the above information? A simple phone call could answer any questions you might have. Another source would be to talk to other members who have served in the same board position, or committees as your proposed nominee? You have a number of alternative methods of accessing as well as assessing the chapter service and character traits of your candidate. I urge you to avail yourself of them before writing a name on the Gold Brush Nomination Form.

The Gold Brush Award is the highest honor that the chapter can bestow upon a member. It is a once in a lifetime award. Therefore, in order to preserve the integrity and prestige associated with the award, it is important that only the most worthy and deserving member ultimately be chosen. When the next Gold Brush Award recipient is announced, those in attendance should be able to conclude unanimously that the goal has been fulfilled.
